- Known for abstract paintings based on life, nature, and feelings created using a grid





INSTRUCTIONS

- We will start with a grid like Agnes Martin.
 - Create dots every inch vertically on the side of the paper
 - Repeat this horizontally using the vertical dots to tell us where to put our ruler
 - Connect the dots vertically and horizontally
- We will use the grid as our guide to make the painting
 - You can create a painting based on nature, emotions, or an event in your life like Martin. You will use your warm up sketch as inspiration
- Start creating your painting in the grid!
 - You can use the grid to help you create different GEOMETRIC SHAPES.
 - You can divide your grid even further by creating HALVES, THIRDS, or QUARTERS
 - You can use the grid to draw PATTERNS
