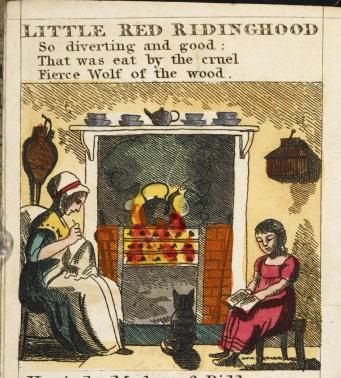
Parts of a Story

Plot: Plot is what happens in the story.

Setting: Setting includes the time and place of the story's events.

Character: Characters are those who play a role in the story.

Conflict: Conflict represents the problem in the story. Resolution: How the story ends..

Verb

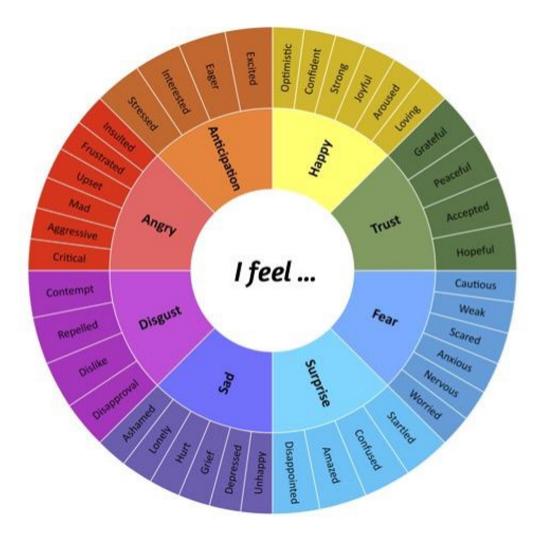
A word that describes an action.

Roll, jump, dance, and wiggle are all verbs.

Emotions

A word that describes how you feel, or a feeling.

Happy, peaceful, angry, and sad are all emotions.



Monologue

monologue, in literature and drama, is a speech by one character. Sometimes it is the innermost thoughts of the character. The character speaking to themselves. A monologue can also be a speech by one character spoken to another character.
