OBJECTIVES

- Students will learn about mosaic art.
- Students will utilize everyday objects to create mosaic paintings.
- Students will develop a greater understanding of shape and color.
- Students will learn to think outside of the box and problem solve for what materials will best embody different shapes and colors in the paintings or images they replicate in their mosaic.













MATERIALS

 Found Objects (color and shape)

Colored Straws


 Strong Surface (thick paper, cardboard, ect,)

- Glue
- Pencil
- Marker
- Paintbrush













INSTRUCTIONS

- Gather small found objects to use to create your mosaic work of art.
- Draw the outline of the image you would like to portray onto your sturdy surface.
- Use a marker to trace the outline of your image.
- Spread your found objects out blending them together inside your image.
- Consider color, shape and size before you glue your objects to the surface.
- Adhere your objects using a paint brush and glue.


