Core Content Learning Objective: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- understand & demonstrate basic story elements of ALL stories- understand & develop a story with 4 sequential elements- understand & recognize an 'inciting incident' in a story	Assessment: <ul style="list-style-type: none">-did the students work together to create a story – with selection of setting and characters-did students collaborate on selecting an effective inciting incident-did students work together to clearly create instructions for other teams to follow and execute the 'storydraw'-were students able to constructively analyze the inciting incident of other teams	
Arts Learning Objective: <ul style="list-style-type: none">-develop drawing strategies for visually telling a story-develop listening, speaking and performing skills by working cooperatively to create & perform a storydraw-collaborate on visual story development	Assessment: <ul style="list-style-type: none">-did team listen & follow guided instructions from other teams-did narrator clearly guide other teams in drawing elements of story	

Summary of the Lesson:

- teacher & artist will review story structure elements
- artist will demonstrate a 'storydrawing' technique created for family-storytelling engagement

- classroom will divide into small groups, or 'teams' - to collaboratively create and perform original stories to the rest of the class (or teams)
- each 'team' will create & choose the setting of their story
- each 'team' will create & choose the characters that will exist in their story
- each 'team' will collaborate on choosing the 'inciting incident' which will change the 'status quo' of their story
- each 'team' will move the characters (drawn on small pieces of paper) as they respond to the 'inciting incident' in each teams' story
- each 'team' will choose their own ending to the guided 'story'

- each 'team' will choose a narrator for their 'team'
- narrator (of each 'team') will deliver 'instructions' to the other 'teams' in the class

- each 'team' will analyze and discuss the 'inciting incident' of other 'teams'



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ARTS LESSON STRUCTURE: Attention, Review, Teach, and Support

Attention: How will you prepare the students for the lesson?

Teacher

- teacher will review key elements for a story
- teacher will review the genre of realistic fiction
- teacher will review following directions

Artist:

- artist will review, explain and 'show' (illustrate) story structure elements and concepts.
- artist will demonstrate/model the 'story drawing' technique project to the students.
- artist will support the team's efforts to create and deliver instructions for completion of the 'story drawing'.

Review: What will you review? What is the academic vocabulary for the lesson?

Teacher

- characters (main and supporting)
- setting (time and place)
- narrator of the story
- problem/solution
- sequence of events

Artist:

- story
- story structure
- setting and characters
- narrator
- sequential
- inciting incident
- status quo

Teach: What will you do to teach the content?

Teacher

- teacher will review story summaries (teacher will provide students with a graphic organizer)
- teacher will review characters, setting, problem and solution, and sequence of events leading to the solution

Artist:

- demonstrate and 'model' the project – step by step
- explain the sequence or order of story structure and development
- explain inciting incident and personalize the concept – what would an inciting incident be in their classroom at this moment?

Support: What will you assign the students to complete and how will you support their learning?

Teacher

- teacher will assign students to write a summary of the story that they created

Artist:

- the students will divide into small groups (4 students), or 'teams', to discuss and create their own story setting, character selection and 'inciting incident'.
- each team will execute their 'storydraw' and 'solve'/resolve the ending to the guided story by the narrating 'team'
- each team will evaluate and constructively analyze other teams' selection of 'inciting incident'

Closure: What will we do to reinforce learning and close the lesson for today?

- students will be asked to choose **one thing** they learned in the lesson? Choice of participation or not.
- students will be asked to think of one 'inciting incident' that could **change** their lives?
