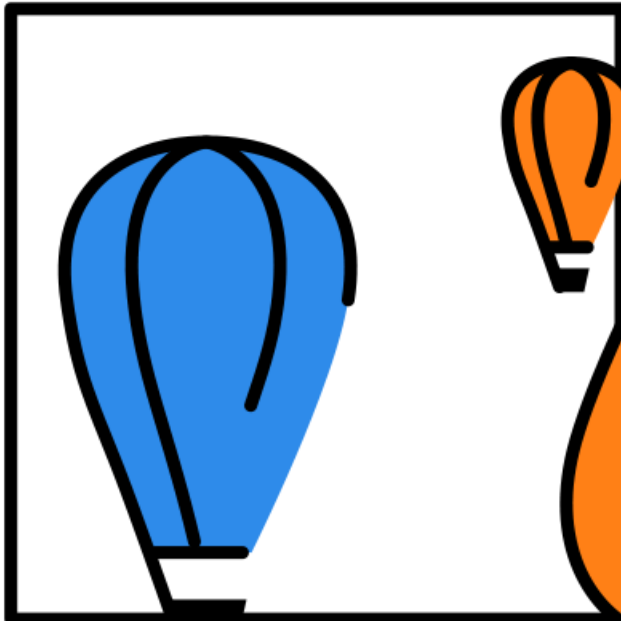
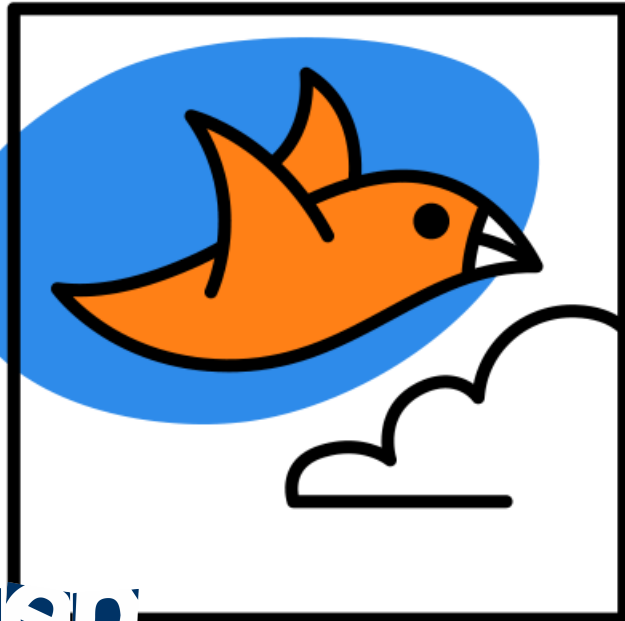


# VOCABULARY

book reports!


Mr. Gould has told me you recently finished two book reports. You will choose one of these as the basis for your project.

I may have let my drawing get out of control!

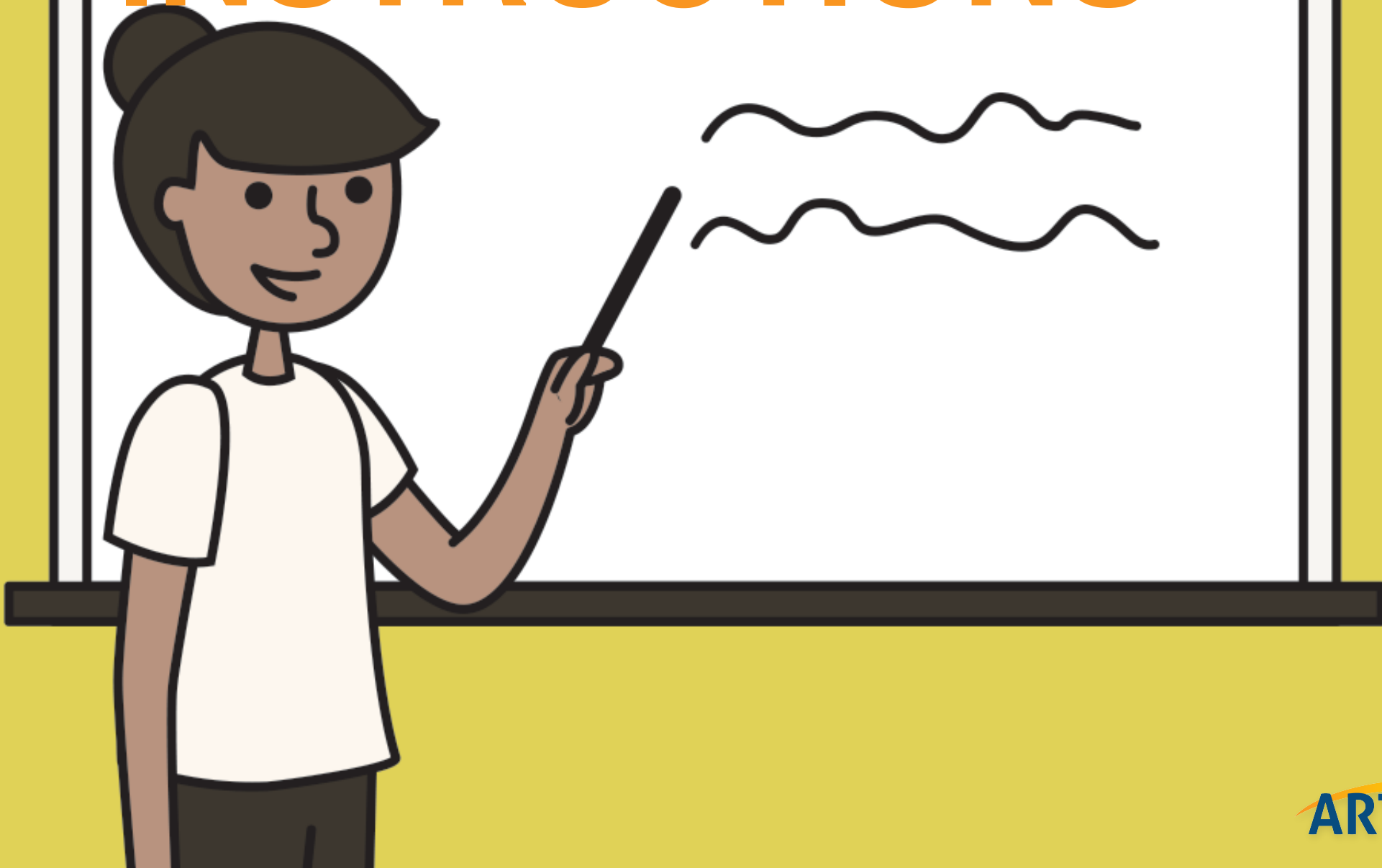
