Core Content Learning Objective: -to determine the 'themes' found in abstract art -to explore 'cause' and 'effect' – music being the cause; the students' watercolors representing the 'effect' from listening to different music		Assessment: - determine if students understand the difference between realistic art and abstract art -to analyze if students understood the concept of 'cause' and 'effect'	
Arts Learning Objective: - explore concept of abstract art -identify shapes and colors in Wassily Kandinsky's artwork -to create a work of abstract art, experimenting with personal shapes, colors and 'inner-feelings' -appreciate the artworks of other students		Assessment: -did students understand and use some of Kandinsky's shapes and forms in their own work? -could students 'get inspired' by the different forms of music to create personal imagery	

## **Summary of the Lesson:**

- -briefly discuss what 'synesthesia' is and how the student will create artworks inspired by music
- -discuss and explain the vocab words
- -discuss and share Wassily Kandinsky artworks; discuss the 5 Kandinsky 'requirements' of being an artist
- -discuss instructions for the lesson: to listen and then think of 5 words inspired by the music being played;
- to draw lines inspired by the music being played; to not overly think about making an image but to 'feel the music' and create.





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ARTS LESSON STRUCTURE: Attention, Review, Teach, and Support

Attention: How will you prepare the students for the lesson?			
Teacher -review of 5 senses – wrote a 'sense' poem	Artist -review & explanation of 'synesthesia': a condition where 2 of your senses are combined -show examples of Kandinsky's artworks – works created by listening to music -review of our 5 senses -introduce concept behind lesson – students will create watercolor paintings in response to music being played		
Review: What will you review? What is the academic voo	cabulary for the lesson?		
Teacher	-we reviewed materials needed for the lesson -we reviewed the vocab words used in the lesson: abstract art synesthesia emotional response organic shapes geometric shapes nonobjective (art, imagery)		





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<u>Teach:</u> What will you do to teach the content?			
Teacher -review color words; talked about feelings	Artist - I showed examples of Kandinsky's work; how he used symbols to create his own personal visual alphabet		
Support: What will you assign the students to complete and how will you support their learning?			
Teacher -supported students efforts & learning	Artist  -we assigned students to listen and then 'interpret' what they heard – by subconsciously drawing what they were feeling in response to the various music being played;  -we will support their learning by constructive comments on the finished watercolors the students created.  -Hopefully the sharing of student work will elicit surprising discoveries about fellow classmates' innermost 'personal imageries'.		
Closure: What will we do to reinforce learning and close the lesson for today?			
Through constructive critiques on the artworks created; to summarize the experience of creating art for art's sake; to understand that there is value in non-objective imagery to experience and appreciate a (possibly) 'new way' to ma	<i>'</i> ;
