<b>Core Content Learning Objective:</b> <b>Standard - CC.1.3.4.C</b> Describe in depth a character, setting or event in a story or drama, drawing on specific details in the text.	<b>Assessment:</b> Students will create a character sketch of one of the main characters from our story, The Secret Message.	
<b>Arts Learning Objective:</b> To discuss character in poetry. To review what metaphor is, learn what a character sketch is, and to write an "I AM" Poem.	<b>Assessment:</b> The students will write "I AM" Poems.	



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**Summary of the Lesson:**

We'll discuss story elements, and define metaphor and character. We'll explore character sketches and possibly have the students read the character sketches they write with Taylor. The students will then brainstorm character traits and write "I AM" poems. They will then have the opportunity to read their work to the whole group.



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ARTS LESSON STRUCTURE: Attention, Review, Teach, and Support

<b>Attention: How will you prepare the students for the lesson?</b>	
<b>Teacher</b> Students are asked to determine story structure elements of the story we read, so they should have a strong background for identifying characters and traits.	<b>Artist</b> For Session 2 of this lesson, we'll start by reviewing character traits and revisiting the interview we did in Session 1. I'll then ask the students to write I AM in their ArtsLink notebooks and pick two character traits to complete the sentence.
<b>Review: What will you review? What is the academic vocabulary for the lesson?</b>	
<b>Teacher</b> The academic vocabulary for this lesson will be characters, character traits, and character sketches.	<b>Artist</b> The academic vocabulary for this lesson will include character, character traits, metaphor, and interviews. We discussed this during Session 1.

<p><b>Teach: What will you do to teach the content?</b></p>	
<p><b>Teacher</b>            Characters and character traits will be taught as we read stories, novels, poems, and watch videos. Characters' actions, thoughts, feelings, etc. will be discussed in order to develop and understand different traits of different characters. Students will do a journal entry describing their own traits.</p>	<p><b>Artist</b>            Using a PPT that will include text, video, and images, I'll share definitions and examples. We'll read and critique an I AM poem. The lesson will be a mix of whole-group discussion and individual time to brainstorm and write.</p> <p>In Session 2, I'll show a video about metaphor and then we'll practice creating metaphors as a whole group.</p>
<p><b>Support: What will you assign the students to complete and how will you support their learning?</b></p>	
<p><b>Teacher</b>            Students will create their own character sketch of themselves or a character from a story, whichever they choose.</p>	<p><b>Artist</b>            After whole-group discussion and metaphor-creating, the students will be given time to turn their I AM sentences into metaphors. As they do, I'll be available on camera and to answer questions and give encouragement.</p>
<p><b>Closure: What will we do to reinforce learning and close the lesson for today?</b></p>	
<p>We'll provide time for the students to share their metaphors, and I'll also share a poem of mine that begins with an I AM metaphor.</p>
