Core Content Learning Objective: Identify the parts of a story Collaborate with a partner to complete a story map	Assessment: Ability to identify parts of a story, and create a completed story map	
Arts Learning Objective: Collaborate to create story map Model principles of active listening	Assessment: Share complete story idea.	
Summary of the Lesson: Students are reminded of active listening skills, and are invited to use their imaginations to come up with a story idea for their pencil as a character. They discuss personification, and conflicts between characters in stories or movies. After a review of the parts of the story, and an introduction to the story map, students are partnered to work together to fill the blocks of the story map.
