Summary of the Lesson:

Students will review pointillism and color theory from last class. Students will note how color mixing with pointillism is like addition (two separate colors combined make another color). Students will continue their backgrounds of their portrait. Once complete, students will move onto their shirts using the same method. Students will be encouraged to use complementary colors and color mixing within their shirts.

Teacher Middle Above Under Line Ruler	 Pointillism- the practice of applying small strokes or dots of color to a surface so that from a distance they visually blend together. Primary Colors- set of colors that can be mixed to produce all other colors (red, yellow, blue) Secondary Colors-color resulting in the mixing of two primary colors Accent- a detail used for emphasis Contrast- the striking difference between two elements
